

CV - Professor Peter Hopkins

A Professor of Social Geography at Newcastle University, I have an international reputation in the social sciences, was elected a Fellow of the Academy of Social Sciences in 2018 and serve on the Academy's nomination committee to identify leading and emerging influential social scientists. I recently completed a three-year term as Newcastle University's first University Dean of Social Justice.

I have an international reputation for social geography and experience in research management, research strategy and research assessment of all types. I have successfully line managed 8 postdoctoral researchers, served on ESRC's Strategic Advisory Network, ESRC's Covid and Ethnicity commissioning panel, and as a Vice Chair for European Commission fellowships. Securing over £3.2million in external income, I have published 11 books, 9 special issues, over 100 journal articles and chapters and have served as the Managing Editor of *Gender, Place and Culture* for 4 years.

A wide-ranging teaching and examining portfolio, at all levels and on a range of topics. I currently serve at the external examiner for the MSc Social Research Methods at Dundee (2018-2022) and will shortly be participating in the programme approval process for Geography at Southampton. I was awarded Newcastle University's Vice Chancellors Distinguished Teacher Award in 2011. I have supervised 18 PhD students to successful completion in under four years, and have examined 21 doctoral theses in fields across the social sciences.

I received the President's Medal of the Royal Scottish Geographical Society in 2012 and the Gill Memorial Award of the Royal Geographical Society in 2011. I have held visiting positions at Deakin, RMIT, Monash, Western Sydney and the NUS and have recently completed a year of service as a Distinguished International Professor at Universiti Kebangsaan Malaysia.

KEY LEADERSHIP ROLES

University Dean of Social Justice, 2018 – 2021

This university-wide cross-cutting Dean role involved embedding social justice within several functions of Newcastle University. Implemented the University's Engagement and Place Strategy Transformative Initiative on Social Justice by setting up a Social Justice Advisory Group, developing a portfolio of social justice projects, and integrating social justice into university initiatives on education, global and research (budget 250k). Led on Newcastle University's successful application to become a University of Sanctuary and contributed to Newcastle's strong performance in the KEF for third and voluntary sector engagement.

Research Director for Geography 2017 - 2018

Oversight of research mentoring meetings with colleagues in Geography. Secured external review for 192 outputs for Geography for REF 2021 preparations and utilised a research away day to engage in a collective exercise to identify our strategy and vision as a subject area.

Academic Director of the ESRC North East Doctoral Training Centre 2015 - 2016

Played a leading role in the reaccreditation of the ESRC Doctoral Training Partnership between Newcastle and Durham. This application was successful with 28 studentships per year being allocated to the consortium (equivalent of around £11 million pounds over the 6 years). Many other consortia received a reduction in the previous number of allocated studentships, but the North East did not.

Postgraduate Director, School of Geography, Politics and Sociology 2010 - 2013

Chaired the School Postgraduate Research Committee with oversight of the recruitment, admission, induction, progression, and completion of PGR students across the School. Ensured GPS compliance with the Code of Practice and oversaw submission for ESRC and AHRC studentship funding. Role included overall responsibility for 150+ doctoral students and a budget of 183k. Served as a member of School Executive Board and HaSS Graduate School Committee.

Director of Postgraduate Research for Geography 2008 - 2012

Led on all aspects of marketing, recruitment, induction, progression, and completion of PhD students in Geography. Led on writing the human geography pathway statement for the NEDTC and acted as pathway leader for Human Geography.
